A NOTE FROM DIRECTOR CARNEY

MORAL TURPITUDE GUIDELINES

During the Academy Council meeting on December 4th, 2025, Council members discussed the issue of moral turpitude as it relates to minimum standards for law enforcement and reserve peace officers outlined in IAC [501-2.1\(5\)](#).

By a unanimous vote, the Council voted to provide hiring authorities with the following guidance concerning moral turpitude: acts specifically listed in 501-2.1(5)(a) **AND** all convictions for indictable offenses **EXCEPT** Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) 1st offense constitute moral turpitude.

What does this mean going forward?

- The Report of Hire has been updated to reflect the Council's decision.
- Any act specifically listed in 501-2.1(5)(a), as determined by a thorough background investigation, constitutes moral turpitude and requires a waiver from the Council before an individual may be hired as a law enforcement or reserve peace officer.
- A conviction for any indictable offense, except an OWI 1st offense, constitutes moral turpitude and requires a waiver from the Council before an individual may be hired as a law enforcement or reserve peace officer.
- Waivers are **NOT** required for simple misdemeanor convictions or OWI 1st convictions.

IOWA THRIVE RESILIENCY PROGRAM

The Iowa THRIVE Resiliency Program is a new, two-year statewide initiative focused on strengthening the mental health and resilience of Iowa's first responders and their families. The program - led by the Mount Vernon-Lisbon Police Department, supported by a DOJ COPS grant, and implemented with the Worldmaker Resilience Institute - will provide trauma-informed training and digital tools tailored to the unique needs of public safety personnel.
